

LANCASHIRE CRICKET LEAGUE - CODE OF CONDUCT ON SOCIAL MEDIA

The Lancashire Cricket League fully understands and acknowledges the right of any member club, its officials, players and members to pass reasonable and considered comment on a specific match or on the sport in general. The League does, however, expect all such social media postings to be constructive and relevant given the potentially unrestricted audience of such sites as Facebook and Twitter. Please be mindful of who may have access to material shared via such social media.

Everyone should apply the usual Codes of Conduct to their behaviour online, by text and e-mail.

The following conditions apply to any social media posting which relates either directly or indirectly to the Lancashire Cricket League. These conditions also apply to any posting that might reasonably be regarded as reflecting on the League in any way.

No social media posting may be made by a member club, official, player or member which:

1. contains any threatening, abusive, insulting or indecent language.
2. discriminates on any grounds of race, colour, ethnic origin, nationality, faith, sexual orientation, social class or disability.
3. contains any message that is offensive, nasty or derogatory in any way.
4. is detrimental to the interests of the Lancashire Cricket League or to the game of cricket in general, or which brings the Lancashire Cricket League or the game of cricket into disrepute.
5. the individual could reasonably be expected to know would implicate a third party in any disciplinary or legal hearings; this may include but is not restricted to the copying and redistribution of any third party social media posting.
6. the individual might reasonably be expected to know would undermine the unity of a team, and or, the standing of the Lancashire Cricket League in general.
7. discloses any matter which is confidential to the Lancashire Cricket League.

All clubs, officials, players and members are reminded that while an individual's opinions may not represent those of the Lancashire Cricket League, they can very easily reflect on the League. As such, all member clubs, officials, players and members are expected to consider the values and the long and proud history of the League in any social media postings that they choose to make.
